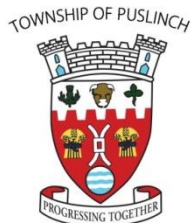

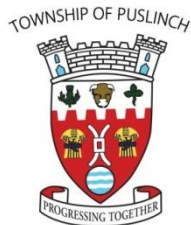

LAUNCH OF ROBERT MOORE'S BOOK AN OVERWHELMING SUCCESS. The introduction of Robert Moore's book, "Puslinch At Work" on Saturday, June 23rd was a decided success. Robert Moore, a former Puslinch resident, now retired to British Columbia, had been researching and writing this book for about a year. Under the sponsorship of the Puslinch Historical Society, he presented the book for sale at the Puslinch Library. This book covers the history of work in the township from the earliest days on record, beginning with the agriculture of the Neutral First Nation, to the mid-1960's. The crowd, assembled in the Brad Whitcombe Room of the library, listened intently while Robert explained his approach to the book and answered questions. All of the copies, which he had brought with him were sold, with several more requests placed. Due to the demand, Robert will be releasing a second printing. The book sells for \$15. Puslinch Kodiaks Senior Men's Fast Pitch

KODIAKS COMPETE AT WORLD'S QUALIFIER. On the June 15-17th weekend, the Puslinch Kodiaks competed in the ISC World Championship Qualifier in Mitchell, Ontario. The Kodiaks opened with a victory on Friday night over the Glanworth Gators. They then were scheduled for an 8 am game the next morning against the eventual runners up in the tournament, the Elmira Expos, who they could not defeat. In a double knockout tournament, they were in a position where they had to keep winning in order to have a chance at qualifying. They ended up beating the Kitchener Diamond Jaxx (who they previously had never beat), and then defeating a team from Cobourg to make it to Sunday. On Sunday morning they matched up against a familiar foe in the Niagara Snappers, who they could not beat, and they were officially eliminated from the tournament. The Kodiaks are now waiting to see if they will be invited to the World's Tournament, being held in Kitchener in August. Their next tournament play is close to home, in Ponsonby, where games will begin on July 6th and run throughout the weekend.
